BASEBALL: Extended NCAA record for most consecutive post season to 18 NCAA Tournaments. Head coach Tim Corbin reached 1,000 career wins on March 5, 2024.



MEN'S **BASKETBALL:**

Ezra Manjon makes Memorial Magic and hits a buzzer-beater to defeat Texas A&M. Manjon made the SEC Community Service

Team and was a recipient of the Brad Davis Community Service Award granted by the SEC.

WOMEN'S BASKETBALL:

Finished 2023-24 season with 23 wins, the most for Vanderbilt since the 2011-12 campaign, matching that team's win total. Also earned its first March Madness



bid since 2014 and collected its first win in the NCAA Tournament in 11 seasons.




BOWLING: Earned an at-large bid to the NCAA Tournament, making their 18th consecutive tournament appearance in the program's 20-year history. They advanced to the regional final before falling to national runnerup Arkansas State.




CROSS COUNTRY: Women's team had the highest finish in the last three years at the SEC Championships. Finished 12th at the NCAA South Regional. The men's team had multiple top-10 finishes in fall meets and Jack DesRoches won SEC Men's Freshman of the Week honors during the season.



FOOTBALL: Punter Matthew Hayball and long snapper Wesley Schelling earned spots on the coaches' All-SEC team, giving Vandy multiple all-conference picks for the first time since 2016. Schelling is the only specialist in Vanderbilt history to earn All-SEC honors from the coaches in multiple seasons.



MEN'S GOLF: Team advanced to match play at the NCAA Championships for the seventh time in program history. Gordon Sargent earned a PGA Tour Card and became the first three-time first-team All-American in program history. Matthew Riedel, William Moll and Cole Sherwood all finished in the top 10 of PGA Tour U.



WOMEN'S GOLF: Team punched their ticket to the NCAA Championships and earned its best NCAA finish since 2014. Coach Greg Allen earned a spot on the WGCA Coach of the Year watch list.

SWIMMING: Set or rebroke 10 individual school records on 14 occasions during the season while also setting new standards in all five relay events. A total of 18 members of the program combined to record 41 marks that ended the campaign ranked among the top 10 on the school's all-time performer list. Junior Kailia Utley became the first Commodore to compete at the NCAA Championships since 1989 when she qualified in the 100 and 200 butterfly.



MEN'S TENNIS:

Concluded the season No. 42 in the ITA rankings after earning an at-large bid to the NCAA Tournament. the program's first appearance in the

championship since 2019. Also picked up four wins over nationally ranked opponents during head coach Scott Brown's first season in charge of the program.

WOMEN'S

TENNIS: Advanced to an NCAA Super Regional for the second time in three seasons after defeating No. 12 national seed Ohio State to win the NCAA Columbus Regional.



That was one of seven victories over nationally ranked teams Vandy recorded in the spring.

VOLLEYBALL:

The program inked its first-ever signing class, which was made up of six freshmen-Reese Animashaun, Madison Bowser, Taryn DeWese, Hailee Mack, Giovanna

Mason and Rachel Ogunleye. They also added graduate transfers Sydney Conley and Isabella

Bareford.

PRIORITY POINTS

Priority points provide a fair and transparent method for determining donor priority and guiding the distribution of benefits. Points are awarded for philanthropic commitment to Vanderbilt Athletics to honor and reward donors' generous financial support.

Priority is assigned first by McGugin Society level and then by priority points within each level, followed by lifetime members by total priority

points, and then all active National Commodore Club members by total priority points. Active membership includes current fiscal year (July 1-June 30) donors to Vanderbilt Athletics. Donor priority is used to assign season, away game and postseason tickets and other associated NCC benefits. 



HAWKINS FIELD


- Home to the two-time national champion VandyBoys, Hawkins Field is an iconic neighborhood ballpark at the heart of the Frist Athletics Village

- More options of club and premium spaces will be added, such as "Home Run Deck" seating atop the leftfield wall, a club with a partially submerged behindthe-plate vantage point, and private suites that will form a new third level above the existing press box
- 360-degree stadium views
- A new entry atrium and a new 20,000-square-foot building beyond right field will provide space for enhancing both the fan and student-athlete experience



LUMMIS FAMILY TENNIS CENTER

- All existing student-athlete and coaches' facilities will be renovated
- New seating options to provide unobstructed viewing of all courts, air conditioning, new upwardfacing LED lighting and insulated walls with ballresistant covering

TICKET OFFICE

The Vanderbilt Athletics ticket office is on the first level of McGugin Center on Jess Neely Drive. Office hours are 8:30 a.m.-5 p.m. CT, Monday through Friday. For more information, please call the ticket office at 877-44-VANDY.

ONLINE TICKET MANAGEMENT/ MOBILE TICKETING ASSISTANCE

PARKING

SEASON PARKING

Season parking will be assigned based upon NCC priority and can only be purchased by season ticket holders. Lots and/or spaces can be requested upon season ticket renewal or purchase. Parking contributions are due at the time of purchase or renewal.

TICKET PAYMENT

Payment must be made by cash, check, American Express, Discover, Mastercard or Visa. Checks should be made payable to Vanderbilt University. Each order includes a service charge. All sales are final. PER-SEAT, PER-SPORT PRIORITY SEATING


Vanderbilt Athletics utilizes a per-seat, per-sport model for all season tickets which debuted in 2021 for football, men's basketball, women's basketball and baseball. Per-seat gift requirements are non-tax-deductible gifts in support of Vanderbilt student-athletes. This refined model for priority seating removes pricing and process barriers so more fans can purchase Vanderbilt season tickets without meeting a minimum donation.

SINGLE-GAME PARKING

Vanderbilt Athletics offers single-game parking passes for football and basketball. Game day parking is available on a first-come, first-served basis in the 25th Avenue Garage. Passes can be purchased at vucommodores.com or by calling the Vanderbilt Athletics ticket office at 615-322-4653.


FIRSTBANK STADIUM 2024 SEATING CHART



BRIDGE

Located on the west side of FirstBank Stadium, amenities include chair-back seating and covered seating, a drink rail standing area, private concessions and bar and access to private restrooms.

WEST SUITES

16 suites are located on the west side of FirstBank Stadium. Suite holders receive 10 season tickets and four season parking passes. Suites include a variety of amenities, including complimentary food and beverages with an open bar, windows that can be opened and closed, leather stadiumstyle seating, access to private restrooms, TVs and complimentary Wi-Fi.

NORTH END ZONE (NEW IN 2024)

FIELD LEVEL SEATING

\$1,100 per seat (\$350 ticket + \$750 seat donation)

Located at field level in the north end zone, guests will experience an unrivaled and upclose vantage point to soak in all the action at FirstBank Stadium. Amenities include:

- Reserved tabletop seat, covered and protected from the elements
- Convenient access to an exclusive climatecontrolled hospitality lounge with private restrooms
- Complimentary game day buffet, along with snacks and nonalcoholic drinks
- Cash bar with craft and domestic beer, wine and specialty cocktails
- Televisions mounted above the seating outdoors, and inside the hospitality lounge to allow guests to keep up with all of the action around the country
- Opportunity to purchase game day parking in Kensington Garage with convenient access to north entry gates

TERRACE SEATING

\$800 per seat (\$350 ticket + \$450 seat donation)

Located on the main concourse level in the north end zone of FirstBank Stadium, the second-level ledge provides spectators an entry-level premium offering. Amenities include:

- Reserved tabletop seat
- Convenient access to new fan amenities on main concourse level
- Dedicated in-seat wait service to purchase food and beverages
- Opportunity to purchase game day parking in Kensington Garage with convenient access to north entry gates

SOUTH END ZONE (OPENING 2025)

The transformation of FirstBank Stadium will continue with the opening of the south end zone facility in 2025. The new multi-floor building spanning more than 130,000 square feet will include student-athlete amenities, along with numerous exciting fan experience enhancements and diverse premium seat offerings.

SOUTH SUITES

As part of the transformation of FirstBank Stadium, 15 luxury suites will be constructed into the south end zone on three levels to offer fans the ultimate viewing experience. The suites will include 12 padded outdoor seats and four barstools. Each individual private suite lounge includes additional seating, along with televisions, a refrigerator and a wet bar area. Suite holders will be able to treat their guests to the ultimate in luxury and convenience in their private suite.

FIELD CLUB

Located at field level in the south end zone, the field club will provide guests with a unique and

up-close view of the action with some firstclass amenities. A field club ticket will include a reserved tabletop outdoor seat with convenient access to the Anchor Down Club, the most premium club space in FirstBank Stadium.

LOGE BOXES

With south end zone loge box seating, guests will enjoy an elevated view from a spacious bar top seat. Boxes will be arranged in four-, six- and eight-seat configurations. 





FAQs

Is my contribution to the National Commodore Club tax-deductible?

Contributions to the NCC are 100 percent tax-deductible if you decline all benefits.

What is the per-seat gift requirement attached to season tickets?

Per-seat gift requirements are non-tax-deductible gifts in support of Vanderbilt student-athletes. These gifts are included in the cost of season tickets and parking for football, men's basketball, women's basketball and baseball.

When are NCC seating and parking contributions due?

Seating and parking donations are included in the total price of season tickets and parking and are due at the time of purchase or renewal.

Will per-seat gift requirement paid toward football season tickets be applied toward basketball and/or baseball season tickets?

No. Annual per-seat gift requirements are included in the total cost of season tickets and parking and may not be applied across multiple sports.

Do my historical priority points and loyalty matter?

All historical points have been maintained within each donor/season ticket holder's account. Under the updated priority system, all donors and season ticket holders are rewarded for their annual investments in Vanderbilt Athletics. Please reference the priority points chart on page 8 for details.

Are per-seat donations tax-deductible?

No. As of January 2018, donations tied to seating and parking are not tax-deductible.

Do gifts count toward my seats and parking?

No. Donations made outside of the purchase of season tickets and/or parking may not be applied as per-seat donations for any sport.
